Course Length: Year-Long

Course Description: The Introduction to Lifetime and Recreational Sports elective Physical Education class will introduce students to sports and activities that they can enjoy for their entire life. The Advanced Lifetime Sports class will expand on concepts and techniques learned in the Introduction class. Terminology, rules, skills, and strategies will be covered in these classes. Some of the activities that may be covered are archery, badminton, bowling, golf, pickle ball, tennis, table tennis, volleyball, and softball.

Grading Policy: Students will be graded on participation, attendance, effort, conduct, sportsmanship, quizzes, homework, and a final exam. Because physical education is a participation class, attendance is very important. Points will be deducted from students' grades even if the absence is excused. Extra credit may be offered throughout the semester.

Homework Policy: Homework will be given throughout the semester to reinforce the basic concepts of Lifetime Sports. One or two homework assignments will be given for each unit covered during the semester. Homework points will be added to the total points to determine the final grade.

Late Work/Absent Work Policy: It is the students' responsibility to get any work that was missed because of an absence. Late work will be accepted one day late for 50% credit. Any work turned in later than one day, will not be accepted. Students are also responsible for any work that should be completed because of assignment to IRP. If work is not done in IRP, the absence from class will be considered UNEXCUSED.

Miscellaneous Information: Students are expected to dress EVERY DAY for class. Cell phones are to be left in the lockerroom. Cell phone use during class will not be tolerated. Cell phone use may result in loss of participation, ASD, Tuesday School, or IRP. Several field trips will be taken to the bowling alley and the golf course. This class is not INTRAMURALS!
